The Archdiocese of New Orleans is seeking bids on a roughly \$15 million project to replace a senior citizen apartment complex in the Lower 9th Ward destroyed during Hurricane Katrina and later demolished. Contractors have until May 27, 2014 to bid on construction of **Villa St. Maurice**, a five-story apartment building with 77 one-bedroom units at **500 St. Maurice Avenue**. The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development will subsidize rents.

Dennis Adams, executive director for Christopher homes, said the project includes a complete renovation of the historic Convent for the Sisters of Perpetual Adoration, which was also damaged when floodwaters breached the Industrial Canal levee during Hurricane Katrina. Adams said the convent, which dates back to 1899, will undergo a complete

renovation so that the building can be rehabilitated into community spaces for the apartment complex. The building will include offices, a beauty parlor, meeting space, a computer lab and an exercise room.

Custom designed for the Lower 9th Ward with 24 flexible stops, a ride on one of three 14-seat Lil' Easy Dodge Sprinters (which can hold two wheelchairs) requires a reservation. You need a reservation at least an hour in advance and we will be able to pick you up and drop you off at any of the three main transfer points or any of the 24 flexible stops. The buses circulate every hour on a fixed-route trip between the three transfer points that connect people to major bus routes without an advance trip request. These fixed stops are major destinations in the community and include a grocery store and post office. **Riding the Lil' Easy costs \$1.25**, the same as riding a regular NORTA bus. All RTA tokens, passes and transfers are acceptable on the Lil' Easy. **The service operates from 5am to 10pm weekdays and 6am to 10pm weekends and holidays.** It provides easy connections to RTA and St. Bernard Parish (SBURT).

The RTA Para-transit **Service operates from 5:00 a.m. to midnight, 365 days a year.** The system operates within the urbanized area of Orleans Parish as required under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

The New Orleans Regional Transportation Authority (NORTA's) Para-transit Service is a shared-ride, curb-to-curb program available for those who are functionally unable to independently use the RTA fixed-route system either all of the time, temporarily or under certain circumstances. Companions are charged at the same fare amount as the ADA passenger. Please have the exact fare ready. Drivers do not make change or accept checks.

Shared Rides

RTA Para-transit Services is a shared public transportation service. Whenever possible, the RTA will schedule rides with multiple passengers.

Eligible RTA Para-transit patrons can make service reservations between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday, and from 8:00 to 4:00 p.m. on
